Sonja then appears as a burst of color that gives his life a deeper sense of significance and intrigue. Ove remarks that everything in his life is flat and pointless, and that he only sees black and white.

Ove start to remember his memories back when he thinks that Sonja is the meaning of life he seek after all, it begun in restaurant when he realize that he not enough money to eat at a restaurant. This following statement is supported by what the narrator says:

So he could afford to let her order whatever she wanted from the menu" (Backman, 2012: 116)

The author says that it suggests Ove thinks of Sonja and orders anything she wants from the menu. That way, he avoids disappointing Sonja on their first date. Then he recalls an episode from his suicide attempt, which reminds him that he once did such a thing for Sonja, who has become the new purpose of Ove's life since his father's death.

The second proofs from the researchers shows that After Ove and Sonja started dating, as evidenced by the time Ove proposed to Sonja, he remembers the events leading up to his nearly fatal suicide attempt. The narrator's statements corroborate the following quotation:

She wanted to get married, so Ove Proposed" (Backman, 2012: 118)

She wasn't angry... She started Laughing" (Backman, 2012: 117)

Ove notices this as he looks at Sonja, who is not upset but rather laughing. Ove learns to adore Sonja when he discovers she is not upset and instead urges him to sit down and relax. "Ove stayed there with her hand in his for several hours" (Backman, 2012:119)
